Pulkit from Jaisalmer writes to me that it was great to see the workers who built the Kartavya path during the 26th January parade. Jaya from Kanpur writes that she enjoyed seeing different aspects of Indian culture in the tableaux included in the parade. Women Camel Riders and the women contingent of CRPF, who took part in this parade for the first time, are also being highly appreciated.
- **DEMOCRACY IN OUR VEINS:** Democracy is in our veins, it is in our culture - it has been an integral part of our work for centuries. By nature, we are a Democratic Society. Dr. Ambedkar had compared the Buddhist monks union to the Indian Parliament. He described it as an institution where there were many rules for Motions, Resolutions, Quorum, Voting and counting of votes.
- **YOGA DAY AND MILLETS:** Yoga Day and our different types of coarse grains - Millets have a lot in common. Just as people have made yoga and fitness a part of their lives by taking active participation on a large scale; similarly people are adopting millets on a large scale.
- **NUTRITIOUS AND DELICIOUS DISHES MADE FROM MILLETS:** Today G-20 summit events are going on in every corner of India and I am happy that in every corner of the country, wherever the G-20 summit is being held, nutritious and tasty dishes made from millets are included in it. You can imagine that this effort of the country and the increasing demand of Millets in the world is going to give strength to our small farmers.
- **IMPROVEMENT IN INDIA'S RANKING:** Today India's ranking is 7th in Patent Filing and 5th in Trademarks. Talking about patents only, there has been an increase of about 50 percent in the last five years. In the Global Innovation Index too, India's ranking has improved tremendously and now it has reached 40th position, while in 2015, India was far behind at the 80th position in the Global Innovation Index.
- **'KACHRE SE KANCHAN':** It was mentioned in a United Nations report that 50 million tonnes of E-Waste is being thrown away every year. So utilizing E-Waste is no less than making 'Kachre Se Kanchan'
- **ENTHUSIASM FOR SPORTS RISES:** In Kashmir, there is a lot of enthusiasm among the youth regarding sports. In the coming times, many of these youth will win medals for the country and will hoist the tricolour.
- **OUR EFFORTS SHOULD GO ON RELENTLESSLY:** To strengthen our Republic our efforts should go on relentlessly. The Republic becomes strong 'by public participation', 'by everyone's effort', 'by performing one's duties towards the country', and I am satisfied that, our 'Mann Ki Baat', is the emphatic voice of such dutiful fighters. 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EVIDENCE OF 2500 YEARS OF CONTINUOUS HABITATION IN PURANA QILA, EXCAVATION STARTED AGAIN



Identified as the ancient Indraprastha settlement, Purana Qila has evidence of continuous habitation for 2,500 years. The Archaeological Survey of India has started the excavation of Purana Qila for the third time after 2013-14 and 2017-18 which is being led by Vasant Swarnkar. In the last excavation, evidence of pre-Mauryan layers was found. This time the focus is on placing the Painted Gray Ware culture in a stratigraphical context.

Early excavation findings and artefacts include the Painted Gray Ware (a pottery

tradition) dating back to 900 BCE. This includes pottery sequences from the Maurya to the Shunga, Kushan, Gupta, Rajput Sultanate, and Mughal periods. Purana Qila, excavations have been done earlier also for the discovery and evidence of Pandava civilization and culture. The old fort, dating back to the 16th century, was built by Sher Shah Suri and Humayun, the second Mughal emperor. Padma Vibhushan Prof. BB Lal also carried out excavations inside the fort and its precincts in the years 1954 and 1969-73.

ISSUANCE OF AADHAAR TO THE ADULT POPULATION ALMOST COMPLETE, NOW IT'S TIME TO UPDATE

The work of issuing Aadhaar numbers to the adult population in the country is almost complete. The Unique Identification Authority of India (UIDAI) has now intensified work on five areas to provide continuous assistance to the countrymen in daily life, further strengthening data security along with playing a stellar role in furthering the cause of good governance and promoting 'ease of living'.

In this series, UIDAI has urged such people to update their Aadhaar data, who have obtained their Aadhaar 10 years ago and have never updated it in subsequent years. You can get your Aadhaar

updated by submitting proof of identity and address on the myAadhaar portal or by visiting an Aadhaar centre.

The five core areas are – resident centricity, expanding the usage of Aadhaar, security and privacy, continuous technology upgradation, and collaborate with global economies and support them in their aspiration to achieve SDG 16.9 (provide legal identity for all). Since the first Aadhaar number was generated in 2010, UIDAI has issued over 135 crores Aadhaars and has carried out more than 88 crores authentication transactions so far.

NATION SHEDDING THE MENTALITY OF SLAVERY**RASHTRAPATI BHAVAN'S GARDENS WILL NOW BE CALLED 'AMRIT UDYAN'**

Names and symbols reminiscent of slavery are now becoming a thing of the past. Moving in this direction, several initiatives have been taken, including eradicating the mentality of slavery in Amritkaal. Rajpath was renamed Kartavya Path, indigenous cannons were used on Independence Day and Republic Day, the George V statue was replaced by Netaji, featuring Shivaji Maharaj's seal in the Navy flag, and the date of the presentation of the budget changed. President Droupadi Murmu has named the gardens of Rashtrapati Bhavan "Amrit Udyan" in the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav. On January 29, the President participated in the inauguration ceremony of Udyan Utsav-2023 before the "Amrit Udyan" was opened to the general public. This garden will be open to the general public from 31 January to 31 March, except for every Monday, 8 March, and 26 March. This time it will be open exclusively for farmers on March 28, for the differently abled on March 29, for paramilitary forces and police personnel on March 30, and for women, including tribal women SHGs, on March 31.

During the Udyan Utsav, visitors will be able to see 12 varieties of tulips. Also, they will be able to get information about trees, plants, and flowers by scanning the QR code in the garden. Online booking can be done at <https://rashtrapatisachivalaya.gov.in> or https://rb.nic.in/rbvisit/visit_plan.aspx in six slots from 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. On arrival without an online booking, registration will have to be done at the facilitation counter as well as at the self-service kiosk near Gate No. 12 of Rashtrapati Bhavan.

JAN DHAN ACCOUNTS TOTAL BALANCE SURGE TO RS 1.80-LAKH CR

The 47.84 crore basic bank accounts opened under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan Yojana (PMJDY) had a balance of Rs 1.80 lakh crore as of December 2022. Out of this, 26.54 crore are women account holders. Latest figures show that the number of PMJDY account holders in semi-urban and rural areas is around 32 crore. The rest of the accounts are in urban and metropolitan bank branches.

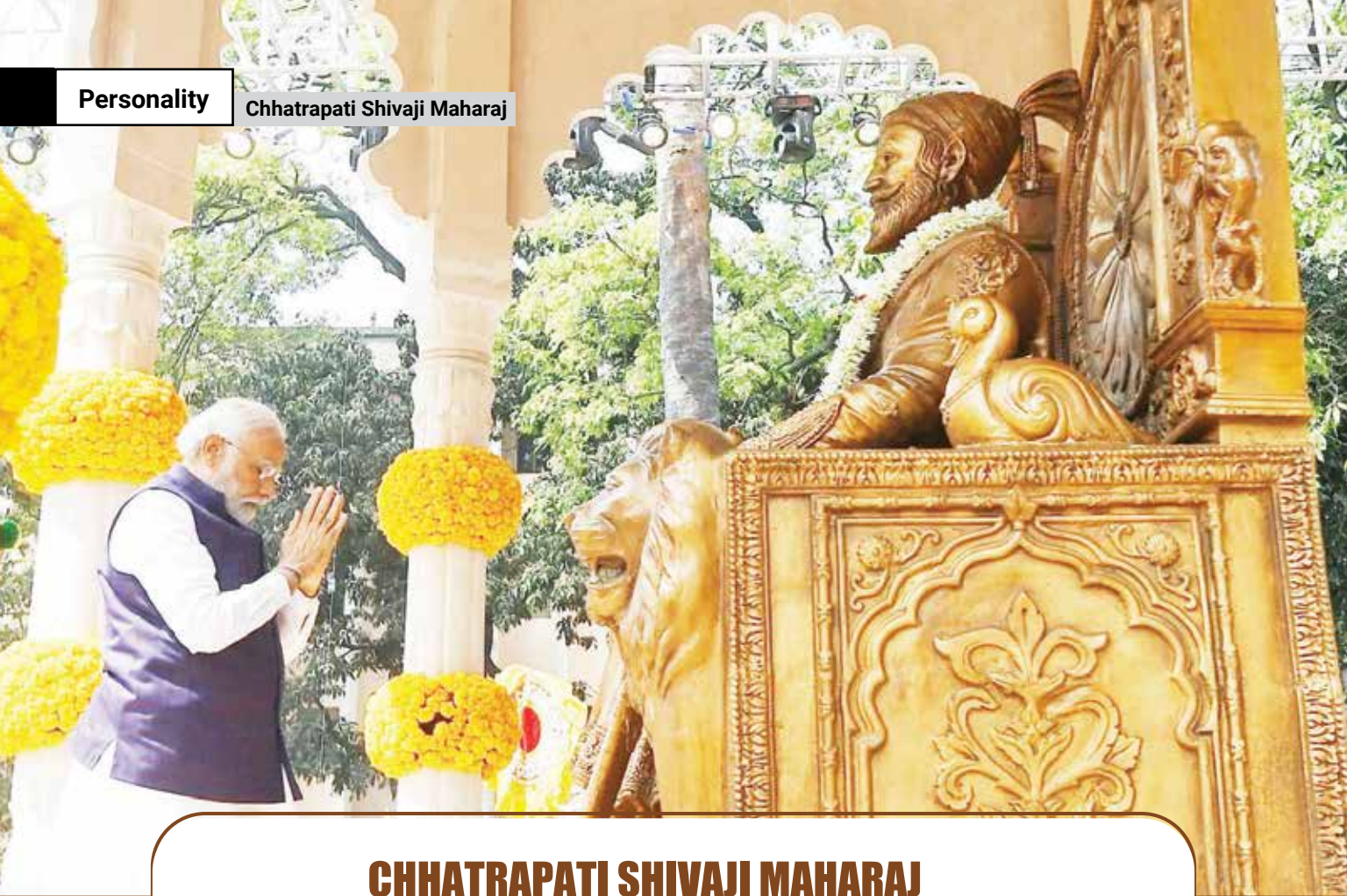
RuPay debit cards are issued to PMJDY account holders with an accidental insurance cover of Rs 1 lakh (Rs 2 lakh for account holders after August 28, 2018). Amidst all this, there are around 20 crore PMJDY account holders who do not have a functional debit card.

TARGET OF SETTING 10 THOUSAND JANAUSHADHI KENDRAS BY 2024

Under the Pradhan Mantri Bhartiya Jan Aushadhi Pariyojana (PMBJP), the Government has set a target of increasing the number of Jan Aushadhi Kendras to 10,000 by March 2024 in order to provide cheap and high-quality generic medicines to the people of the country. These medicine centers offer 50% to 90% less expensive medications than branded pharmacies. There are 1759 different types of medicines and 280 different types of surgical instruments available here.

The Department of Pharmaceuticals and the Ministry of Chemicals and Fertilizers have approved the Pharmaceuticals and Medical Devices Bureau of India's (PMBI) proposal to invite online applications for the establishment of new Jan Aushadhi Kendras in 651 districts across the country.

In the fiscal year 2021-22, these centers sold medicines and surgical instruments worth Rs 893.56 crore, saving the general public Rs 5300 crore. While Rs 758 crore was sold in the current fiscal year 2022-23 through November 30, 2022, resulting in an estimated savings of Rs 4500 crore for citizens. ■



CHHATRAPATI SHIVAJI MAHARAJ BRAVE WARRIOR, POPULAR RULER, AND BRILIANT STRATEGIST

Many heroes have graced India with their extraordinary bravery, sacrifice, and dedication. Shivaji's name stands out among them. Remembering Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj fills all Indians with pride. Shivaji is a name that means "brave warrior," "popular ruler," and "brilliant strategist." He was also very concerned about social issues and religious beliefs. Indians will never forget his efforts to modernise the army, build a navy, replace Persian as the official language with Marathi and Sanskrit, and drive out foreign invaders in the 18th century. India will always be grateful for his sacrifices.

BORN: FEBRUARY 19, 1630

DIED: APRIL 3, 1680

With his coronation in 1674, Shivaji Maharaj chased away the foreign invaders with the proclamation of Hindavi Swaraj. He worked for years to lay a strong foundation of Swaraj, Swadharma, and Swabhasha in India, on which our country built a strong structure. From a common man to attaining the title of Chhatrapati, Shivaji Maharaj won many battles with his courage and intelligence, including the capture of several hill forts

near Poona-Raigarh, Kondana, and Torna at the age of just 18–19 years. The treaty to save the fort, the call between the hills to register a victory over the opposition, the treaty with Maharaja Jaisingh to save the fort of Purandar, and the escape from the captivity of the Mughal Emperor Aurangzeb show his cleverness.

Shivaji Maharaj was born on February 19, 1630, in Shivneri Durg, to Shahji Bhonsale and Jijabai (Rajmata Jijau). The brave Shivaji learned politics and war skills as a child.

Shivaji Maharaj founded the Maratha Empire. His birth name was Shivaji Bhonsle, but he was given the title "Chhatrapati" or "Chief of Kshatriyas" at the time of his coronation due to his administrative and leadership abilities. Shivaji Maharaj's heroics and his enduring saga has also had an impact on India's current geography. Prime Minister Narendra Modi says, "It is a very big question: what is our past, what is our present, and what is it if Shivaji Maharaj is not there." It is difficult to imagine India's glory without Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj. "His sagas after him, his inspirations, have continuously played the role that Chhatrapati Shivaji played in that era."

He conducted numerous new war science experiments and pioneered a new technique of guerrilla warfare. With the help of his disciplined army and well-organized administrative units, Shivaji provided a proper and progressive administration. Despite all of the plans for conquest and state expansion, Shivaji maintained that his rule should be popular with and beneficial to the people. He wrote social and political theses to support this. Shivaji's state was secular.

Shivaji Maharaj extolled Indian beauty by establishing good governance based on religion,

nationality, justice, and public welfare. In his state system, Shivaji also appointed eight ministers known as Ashta Pradhan. Peshwa made the most significant contribution. Shivaji Maharaj died on April 3, 1680, but his biography inspired many revolutionaries in India's freedom struggle, who sacrificed their bodies, minds, and wealth for India's freedom.

"Hindavi Swaraj" by Shivaji Maharaj is a great example of good governance, justice for the backward and disadvantaged, and courage in the face of oppression. Hindavi Swaraj, means self-rule by Indians. Whatever party governs India, the basic ideology has always been to keep the

country free of all foreign military and political influence. Shivaji Maharaj is said to have used the words "Hindavi Swarajya" for the first time, in a letter.

Veer Shivaji's management, the country's use of maritime power, the establishment of a navy with its own strength, and water management are still exemplary subjects. With

the same inspiration as Shivaji Maharaj, India removed the traces of slavery and colonialism on September 2, 2022, and accorded a new flag for the Indian Navy that fully reflects Indianness and the power of the Navy. Until now, the Indian Navy's flag bore the George Cross insignia. The naval flag's Shivaji Maharaj emblem makes every Indian proud of its rich culture. Remembering Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj on his birth anniversary, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had said, "Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj's outstanding leadership and emphasis on social welfare have inspired people for generations." He was always steadfast in his support for the values of truth and justice. We are committed to fulfilling their vision." ■

While establishing the Maratha Empire, Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj began expanding it. He not only won many wars, but he also used his wits to save his empire from the Mughal Emperor, defeating the Mughal army on several occasions.

The size of the General Budget - 2023-24 has increased to more than Rs 45 lakh crore, which shows that India's economy is growing rapidly even in the Covid era. Despite the global crisis caused by the Covid crisis and the Russia-Ukraine war, the increase in the size of the country's budget to Rs 45 lakh crore reflects that India is a fast-growing economy. FOUNDATION STONE OF PROSPEROUS INDIA...

This curiosity may arise in anyone's mind that after 75 years of independence, why has the country needed such a resolution? In fact, there comes a time in the life of every nation when it redefines itself. The biggest pandemic in the last 100 years changed the world, changed the way of working and people's thinking shaped new innovations, then for India, the youngest country in the world, the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav brought such an opportunity, when India once again took the pledge of becoming a Swarnim Bharat. The foundation stone of this big resolution has been prepared in the last nine years.

It is the result of the long-term thinking of the Central Government that in the last nine years, the per capita income has doubled to Rs 1.97 lakh. The size of the Indian economy has also increased and it has become the 5th largest economy in the world from the 10th largest economy 9 years ago. The membership of the Employees' Provident Fund Organization has more than doubled to 27 crores. In the year 2022, a total of 7,400 crore digital payments worth Rs 126 lakh crore have been made through UPI. Toilets have been built in 11.7 crore houses under the Swachh Bharat Mission. Under the Ujjwala scheme 9.6 crore LPG connections were

given. Targeting 102 crore people, the figure for anti-covid vaccination has crossed 220 crore doses. 47.8 crore Pradhan Mantri Jan Dhan bank accounts have been opened in the country. 44.6 crore people have got insurance coverage under PM Suraksha Bima Yojana and PM Jeevan Jyoti Yojana. Cash transfer of Rs 2.2 lakh crore was done to 11.4 crore farmers under PM Samman Kisan Nidhi.

Now, in the first general budget of Amrit Kaal, seven priorities have been set, which have been called 'Saptarishi', to realize the resolution of Swarnim Bharat. To further strengthen the health infrastructure, one hundred and fifty-seven new nursing colleges will be established in co-location with the existing 157 medical colleges established since 2014. The Center will appoint 38,800 teachers and support staff in 740 Eklaya Model Residential Schools for 3.5 lakh tribal students in the next three years. To further the goal of providing pucca houses to all, the outlay for PM Awas Yojana has been increased by 66 percent to Rs 79,000 crore. Not only this, a capital fund provision of Rs 2.40 lakh crore has been made for Railways, considered the lifeline of India, which is 9 times more than the amount provided in 2013-14 and the highest ever.



This year's middle-class friendly budget will strengthen everyone's efforts for 'Developed India'. This budget is a major step in the direction of a capable India, affluent India, self-reliant India, powerful India, and dynamic India. This will expand the area of milk and fish production along with farming, as a result of which farmers, cattle keepers and fishermen will get a better price for their produce.

A special initiative has been taken for women's empowerment with the announcement of Mahila Samman Vikas Patra. Under it, women will now get 7.5% interest annually on savings of Rs 2 lakh.



The decision to increase the limit of the amount that can be kept in the bank's savings account for senior citizens from Rs 4.5 lakh to Rs 9 lakh is also a good initiative. Also, the limit of the Senior Citizen Savings Scheme has also been increased from Rs 15 lakh to Rs 30 lakh. These schemes are very important in the direction of women's empowerment and the welfare of senior citizens.

EMPHASIS ON IT-TECHNOLOGY WITH GREEN DEVELOPMENT

The world is celebrating the International Year of Millets. Against this backdrop, giving special emphasis to various varieties of coarse cereals in the general budget they have been given a new identity as 'Shri-Anna' and many schemes have also been made for its promotion. Small farmers will benefit from this budget. Along with this, emphasis has been laid on promoting the agriculture sector through technology while connecting agriculture with modernity so that the farmers get comprehensive benefits in the long run.

Whether it is the new generation Vande Bharat train or greenfield airports and world-class facilities in railways, the growing network of metro trains, or the Ganga Vilas cruise, aspirational India wants next-generation infrastructure in every sector. 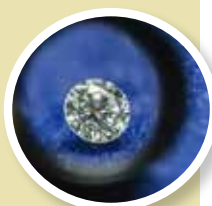
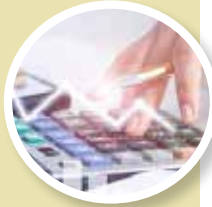

GREEN GROWTH TOWARDS ZERO CARBON EMISSIONS GOAL



To give impetus for promoting an eco-conscious lifestyle, Prime Minister Narendra Modi has presented the concept of "LIFE," i.e., an eco-friendly lifestyle. India is accelerating its efforts to achieve "Panchamrit" and net-zero carbon emissions by 2070 in order to spur green industry and economic transformation. ENERGY STORAGE PROJECTS

- Under the scheme, 200 Compressed Biogas (CBG) plants will be covered with an investment of Rs 10,000 crore.

- Over the next three years, one crore farmers will be assisted in making the transition to natural farming.
- For this, 10,000 Bio-input Processing centres will be set up, which will create a distributed micro fertiliser and pesticide manufacturing network at the national level.

For this, an initiative named "Mangrove Initiative for Shoreline Habitats and Tangible Income" (MISHTI) has been taken. Under this initiative, mangrove plantations will be done in coastal areas with the help of coordination between institutions like MGNREGA and CAMPA.
- **AMRIT DHAROHAR:** This will promote unique conservation values. The scheme will be implemented over 3 years to promote optimum use of wetlands and enhance biodiversity, carbon stocks, eco-tourism opportunities, and income for local communities.

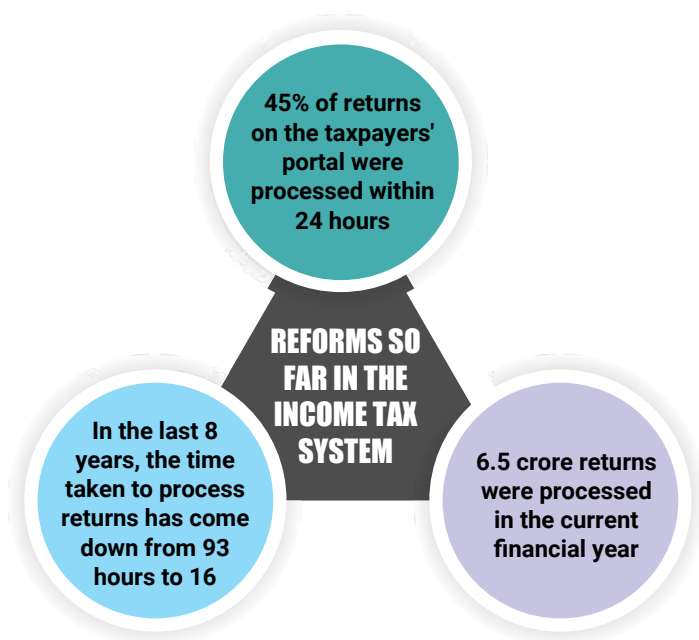
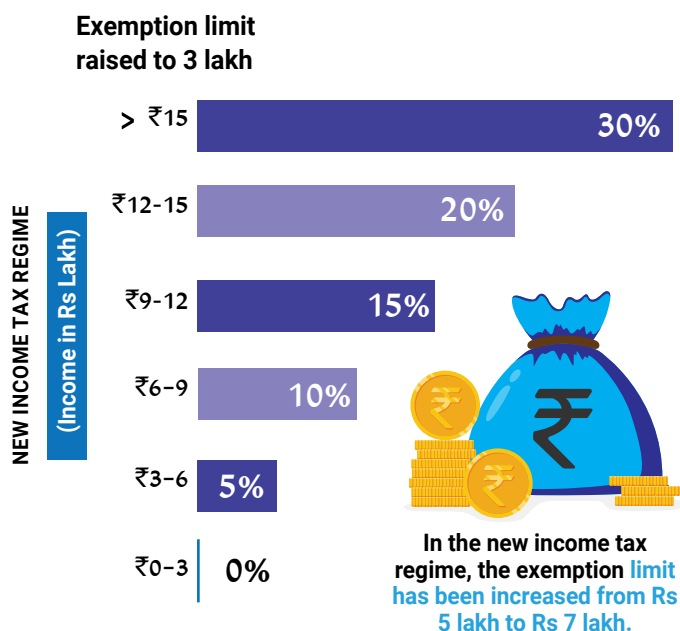


NEW TAX SYSTEM OF NEW INDIA

In order to expand the aspirations of this middle class, the rebate in income tax has been increased by Rs 2 lakh to Rs 7 lakh which has been made income tax-free in the new tax regime. Finance Minister Sitharaman said tax slabs have been changed after a long time. The change in the income tax slab will benefit the middle class.

SIMPLIFIED PERSONAL INCOME TAX FOR THE MIDDLE CLASS





The changes made in personal income tax are based on the principle of reducing the compliance burden, promoting entrepreneurial spirit, and giving tax relief to the citizens. These 5 announcements will become the basis of the country's aspirations and progress.

1. Under the new tax system, the number of tax slabs has been reduced from 6 to 5. No changes have been made to the old tax system. The exemption limit for computing income tax for income above Rs 7 lakh has been increased from Rs 2.5 lakh to Rs 3 lakh.
2. The benefit of the standard deduction will also be given to salaried and pensioner category taxpayers in the new tax regime. A standard exemption of Rs 50,000 will be given to the salaried and Rs 15,000 to the pensioner. Till now it was applicable only in the old system. Salaried employees earning Rs 15.5 lakh or more will get a benefit of Rs 52,500.
3. The Current tax rate in the country is 42.74%, among the highest in the world. The Budget has now reduced the highest surcharge (on income above Rs 5 crore) rate from 37% to 25% in the new Tax regime. This will result in the reduction of the maximum tax rate to 39%."
4. Tax exemption on payment received in lieu of leave on retirement to a non-government salaried employee has been increased from Rs 3 lakh to Rs 25 lakh. For the first time in 20 years, the amount of this exemption was changed.
5. The new tax regime will be kept in default in ITR from the financial year 2023-24. The option of availing the benefits of the old tax regime has also been continued.



- Income taxpayers of 'Profits from business and profession' can change the old regime only once, after which the new tax regime will be applicable to them. Others can choose the old system each year.
- Due to these exemptions and changes in the system of income tax, 38 thousand crore rupees will be saved by the people while in some cases 3000 crore rupees will come extra to the government.
- The central government brought an alternative new tax regime in the year 2020-21.

TAX BENEFITS UP TO 20-25%

In the new tax regime, a person with an annual income of up to Rs 9 lakh will have to pay only Rs 45,000 and Rs 1.50 lakh in the case of Rs 15 lakh, which is only 5% and 10% of his income, respectively. This income group will get the benefit of up to 20-25% in taxes.

DEFENCE SECTOR

A ROBUST BORDER INFRASTRUCTURE, MODERNISING DEFENCE SERVICES

India is moving forward in the defence sector with the mantra of intent, innovation, and implementation. This mantra has accelerated India's development over the years to the point where India is now one of the world's most powerful countries, not just in South Asia. Until 8-9 years ago, India was recognised as the world's largest defence importer; however, the new India has demonstrated determination, innovation, and willpower, and "Make in India" is now a success story in the defence sector. The government has made a maximum provision of Rs 5.94 lakh crore at 13.18 percent in the new budget for indigenization of defence products and modernization of defence systems. The government is determined to strategically strengthen border areas. The Border Roads Organization has been given a budget of Rs 5,000 crore, a 43% increase over the previous year, to strengthen border infrastructure, primarily along the northern border. Border infrastructure will be improved, increasing border connectivity with strategically important infrastructure such as the Sela Tunnel, Nechipu Tunnel, and Sela-Chhabarella Tunnel. Research, innovation, and technology development are regarded as critical for strengthening the armed forces and promoting the self-reliance mission, for which the DRDO has received increased funding in the budget.

- Rs 1,62,600 crore will be spent on modernization and infrastructure development for defence services.
- Defense R&D will be strengthened with a budget of Rs 23,264 crore.
- Rs 1,38,205 crore has been budgeted for defence pensions so that the requirements of "One Rank, One Pension" are met.

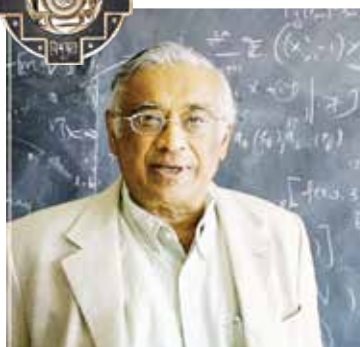

GHULAM MOHAMMAD ZAZ: 8TH GENERATION OF SANTOOR CRAFTSMAN

Santoor craftsman from Jammu and Kashmir, Ghulam Mohammad Zaz, is the eighth generation of his family of craftsmen of stringed instruments including santoor. His family is known for making santoor for 200 years.



Zaz, who has been involved in making musical instruments for almost 7 decades, says that as long he is alive, he will continue to make musical instruments. Ghulam Mohammad Zaz, who is recognized as the last artisan of santoor from Kashmir, says that this art is dying but I hope someone will take it forward and not let it die. Hirabai Lobi of Gir Somnath district of Gujarat will be given the Padma Shri. She has opened many kindergartens to educate children in the tribal Siddh community. She established the Women's Development Foundation in 2004, through which she is working to make women self-reliant by doing sewing work and opening grocery stores. By listening to the radio, she learned the method of making organic fertilizers and started working in that direction. So far, about a dozen cooperative societies have been started.



SNAKE CATCHERS VADIVEL GOPAL AND MASI SADAIYAN HONoured WITH PADMA SHRI

Vadivel Gopal and Masi Sadaiyan are experts in catching dangerous snakes from the Irula tribe. They have been selected for the Padma Award in the category of Social Work (Animal Welfare). They have traveled to other parts of the world for snake catching and training snake catchers. They use indigenous techniques of catching snakes inherited from their ancestors. They have demonstrated the skill of catching snakes in many countries including America, Thailand. In 2017, the duo went to Florida on behalf of the University of Florida for the Python Detection Pilot Project, where they surprised everyone by catching more than 27 pythons.



MUNISHWAR CHANDER DAWAR: LENDING A HELPING HAND TO POOR

EXAM PREPARATION AND TIME MANAGEMENT: Prime Minister Modi stated, "We should be aware of time management in life, not just for exams." He said, students can learn the importance of micromanaging their time and scheduling specific times for each subject by watching their mothers.

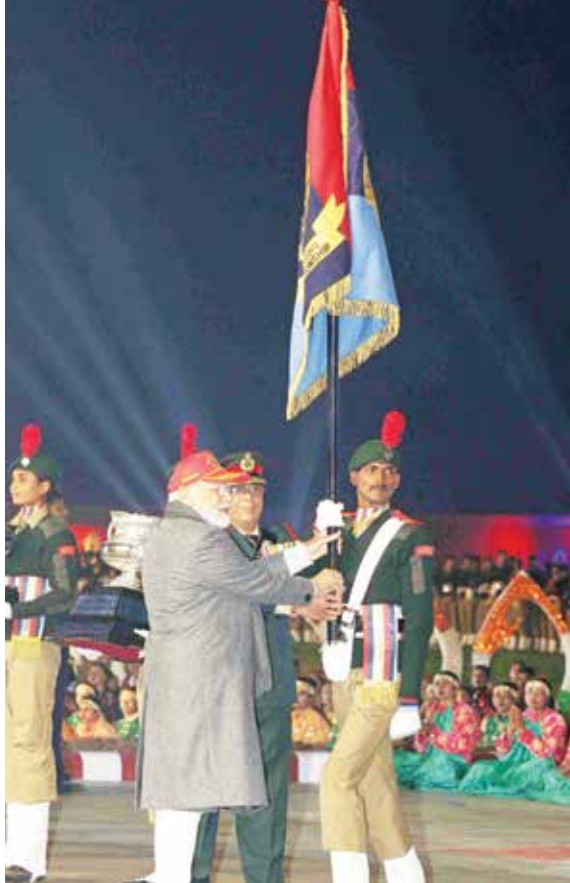

MORE THAN 14 LAKH NCC CADETS IN THE COUNTRY

As per the latest data of Ministry of Defence, the number of NCC cadets in the country is a little over 14.09 lakh. Among these, the number of boy cadets is more than 9.09 lakh while the number of girl cadets is more than five lakhs. The boys NCC cadets comprise 64.52% of the total strength while the percentage of girl NCC cadets is 35.48. Uttar Pradesh has the maximum number of NCC cadets registered, followed by Maharashtra, Tamil Nadu, West Bengal and Madhya Pradesh. NCC also works to provide training through Air Force and Navy. The Air Force has 62 NCC units and the Navy has 71 units.

Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, "This is a time of immense possibilities for the daughters of the country." In the last 8 years, the number of daughters in the police and paramilitary forces has almost doubled. During the last decade, the participation of girls in the NCC has been increasing continuously. A canal project with a capacity of 10 thousand cusecs can irrigate 4.5 lakh hectares of arable land. This project will benefit more than three lakh farmers in 560 villages in Kalburgi, Yadigari, and Vijaypur districts.

This is the reason why the concerned stakeholders are being sensitized by the Ministry to give priority in employment to Agniveers.

IGNOU HAS PREPARED A SYLLABUS FOR AGNIVEERS

The Indira Gandhi National Open University has developed courses that recognize in-service training as credit towards a bachelor's degree for eligible defence forces personnel, including Agniveers. The curriculum has a provision to give up to 50% credit for in-service skill education or training. Successful completion of the requirements of the program will lead to the award of a bachelor's degree equivalent to any other equivalent traditional course recognized by the All India Council for Technical Education and the UGC. ■

PRIVATE FINANCING IN THE CITIES OF THE FUTURE

CITIES AND GOVERNMENTS SHOULD GET READY

Globally, urbanization is increasing rapidly. Cities are developing on many different themes including smart cities, cyber cities, and green cities. Under this backdrop, the first meeting of the G-20 Infrastructure Working Group (IWG) under the chairmanship of India on private financing for such cities along with the challenges and opportunities of the cities of the future, was held at Pune, Maharashtra which is also known as Queen of Deccan on 16-17 January.

The two-day meeting of the IWG was attended by 64 participants from 18 member countries, 8 guest countries, and 8 international organizations. In the meeting chaired by India and co-chaired by Australia and Brazil, the topic 'Financing Cities of the Future - Inclusive, Strong and Sustainable' was at the center of discussion. This theme underlines the message of development based on equality. The theme has been chosen keeping in mind the work done under previous presidencies.

Developing infrastructure as an asset with the 2023 infrastructure agenda, making cities economic hubs of growth, building future-ready urban infrastructure, the role of cities in meeting the Sustainable Development Goals, and energy-efficient and environmentally sustainable infrastructure with the introduction of private financing among many other topics were

also discussed.

A workshop on Financing the Cities of the Future brought together international experts to discuss the issues of how cities of the future must integrate their key administrative functions – their planning and financing – to enhance private participation. It also discussed how cities and governments can position themselves to increase private funding for the cities of the future. The Finance Ministry is guiding the G20's infrastructure agenda to ensure that the G20 acts as a global catalyst to visualize new ideas and accelerate collective action.

After the conclusion of the meeting, on 17th January, the guests got a glimpse of the cultural history of Pune which blends rich history and modernity and tasted the cuisine of the city. The second meeting of the Infrastructure Working Group has been scheduled on March 28 and 29, 2023, in Visakhapatnam, Andhra Pradesh. ■

G-20 PRESIDENCY: FIRST MEETING OF THE HEALTH WORKING GROUP

On one hand, patients come to India for better treatment from Vishwa Kutumb, on the other hand, our health professionals are serving patients in other countries as well. The central government is now not only expanding its scope but is preparing to take the global healthcare industry by storm. With this thought, the Government of India presented the unique initiative 'Heal in India' and 'Heal by India' to the member countries in the first meeting of the G-20 Health Working Group chaired by it. India considers this a great opportunity to showcase its health sector potential, resources, and initiatives on this big platform....

Four meetings of the G-20 Health Working Group are to be held under the chairmanship of India. As part of which the first meeting was held in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala from 18 to 20 January. From preparedness to dealing with health emergencies, facilities like digital health and telemedicine were discussed in the meeting. The meeting was attended by participants from the European Union and special invitees, apart from the G-20 member states. In the meeting, India outlined how it is preparing an action plan to provide modern healthcare to the world community. How telemedicine service along with 'Heal in India' and 'Heal by India' will pave the way for the 'Heal from India' initiative.

India has set three priorities for discussion in the G-20 health track, including solutions to prevent health emergencies, safe universal health coverage, and improving healthcare service delivery with digital health innovation and solutions. On the first day of the meeting, Union Minister of State for Health and Family Welfare Dr. Bharati Pravin Pawar echoed that India's policy regarding the pandemic should be a defining part of the health policy. In fact, today the whole

world is interconnected, and because of this, any crisis can become an economic crisis. Therefore, for the availability of equitable health services to all, efforts are being made to create a framework that can remove the disparities in health services around the world.

In the meeting, Member (Health) of NITI Aayog, Dr VK Paul described Medical Value Travel (MVT) as an important means of addressing healthcare inequities around the world. The purpose of the G-20 would be to encourage bridging this gap. There is a great opportunity to utilize traditional medical systems like Ayurveda in the medical value travel

sector which is growing at a rate of over 23 percent. The G-20 meeting emphasized on setting up of a dedicated board and agency, effective governance, and policy framework to strengthen the medical value travel ecosystem. Also, the need to provide insurance portability under the insurance policy at the international level, coverage of traditional systems of medicine, and liberal visa policy, as well as better air connectivity, were emphasized. ■

ALL INDIA CONFERENCE OF DIRECTOR GENERALS OF POLICE

FOCUS ON BETTER CENTER-STATE COORDINATION

Policing and security challenges are continuously changing, which requires making police administration more efficient through technology. With this aim, the 57th Director General of Police Conference started on January 20 in Delhi, which laid focus on moving firmly down the path of adapting future technologies to the needs of the police. The three-day conference was attended by Prime Minister Narendra Modi on January 21 and 22 and emphasized increasing cooperation between state police and central agencies.



Human resource management has been one of the top priorities of the government led by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. At the All India Conference of Director Generals of Police, Prime Minister Modi stressed making police forces more sensitive, making them friendly to emerging technology through training, taking advantage of technological solutions like biometrics etc, and strengthening traditional police systems like foot patrolling etc. He also stressed the importance of the National Data Governance Framework to facilitate the exchange of data between agencies as well as reforms in prison management. Along with the border, strengthening coastal security was also discussed. The three-day conference was held in hybrid mode from 20 to 22 January 2023. Around 100 invited members including DGPs of State and Union Territories and heads of Central Armed Police Forces and Central Police Organizations participated in the conference physically and around 600 members from across the rest of the country participated in the conference virtually.

SIGNIFICANCE OF DGP/IGP CONFERENCE HAS INCREASED

Prime Minister Narendra Modi has taken a keen interest in the DGP Conference since 2014 and has also encouraged holding annual DGP conferences across the country. Moving away from an earlier culture of token attendance, PM Modi encourages free and informal discussions by attending all sessions of the conference, allowing top police officers to directly brief the prime minister on major policy-making and internal security issues affecting the country. Earlier, this type of conference was held only in Delhi, but Prime Minister Modi made a new beginning by organizing it outside Delhi.

MAULANA ABUL KALAM AZAD

STERLING CONTRIBUTION IN THE PROGRESS OF EDUCATION

BORN: 11 NOVEMBER 1888, DIED: 22 FEBRUARY 1958



Maulana Abul Kalam Azad, a poet and polyglot who was well-versed in several languages like Arabic, English, Urdu, Hindi, Persian, and Bengal, was born on November 11, 1888, in Mecca. He received traditional Islamic education from his father and other teaching scholars at his home in Calcutta.

He adopted the surname "Azad" as a sign of his mental emancipation from the narrow outlook of religion and life. Maulana Abul Kalam Azad became active in journalism and politics at an early age. He joined the revolutionary movement against British rule after being inspired by two prominent

which he joined the Congress in 1920. Just three years later, Maulana Abul Kalam Azad became the youngest President of the Indian National Congress at the age of 35. He was jailed several times by the British from 1920 to 1945 due to his activism in the freedom struggle. While strongly opposing the partition of the country, he envisioned an India that would embrace both Hindus and Muslims. He used to especially participate in the discussion on subjects related to education in the Constituent Assembly. He believed that India as a nation should aspire to high educational standards. As the country's first education minister from 1947 to 1958, he advocated free and compulsory education for all children up to the age of 14.

Abul Kalam Azad established the Adult Education Board for the education of illiterate adults. He was also instrumental in setting up the University Grants Commission and other educational institutions, such as the Indian Institute of Science and the IITs. Maulana Abul Kalam Azad breathed his last on February 22, 1958. His autobiography, "India Wins Freedom," was published in 1959, after his death.

He was posthumously awarded the Bharat Ratna in 1992. To remember his invaluable contribution to the field of education, November 11 is celebrated as National Education Day. Paying tribute to Maulana Abul Kalam Azad on his birth anniversary, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said, "He was an ingenious thinker and a sharp intellectual. His role in the freedom struggle has been very inspiring. He was always very enthusiastic about the field of education and worked tirelessly to promote brotherhood in society."

In 1912, Maulana Azad started a weekly magazine in Urdu called Al-Hilal. The government banned Al Hilal in 1914. Maulana Abul Kalam Azad started another weekly newspaper, Al-Balagh, with the mission of propagating Indian nationalism and Hindu-Muslim unity, which was not only banned by the government in 1916 but also expelled him from Kolkata. Maulana Abul Kalam met Mahatma Gandhi during the Khilafat Movement after

STEADY GROWTH IN INDIA'S TEA PRODUCTION



There is a story in India that just as the British came and left the English language, in the same way, grandmothers used to say that the Britishers came and left India addicted to tea. Tea was undoubtedly discovered in China, but between 1835-40 in India, the then Governor Lord William Bentinck formed a committee in India to apprise the people of Assam about tea after which tea plantation started in Assam. Only 41.90 crore kg of tea was produced in India in 1970-71, which has increased to 128.03 crore kg in 2020-21. Tea is an integral part of Indian heritage as tea is not just a beverage for Indians, it is an emotion, symbolizing India's Atithi Devo Bhava culture. The tea sector has played a significant role in employment generation in the country. Not only the growers, cultivators, and exporters but many startups are based on tea.

REVOLUTIONARY VIJAY SINGH PATHIK

LIT THE FIRE OF FREEDOM WITH HIS PEN



BORN: 27 FEBRUARY 1882, DIED: 28 MAY 1954

Vijay Singh Pathik, known as 'Rajasthan Kesari' and 'Rashtriya Pathik', was born on 27 February 1882 in a village called Guthawali Kala in Bulandshahr district of Uttar Pradesh. His father's name was Chaudhary Hamir Singh Rathi and his mother's name was Kamal Devi. Since childhood, Pathik was strongly influenced by the patriotism of his grandfather, Dewan Indra Singh Rathi, who was martyred in the First War of Independence in 1857. The original name of Vijay Singh Pathik was 'Bhoop Singh', but after the 'Lahore Conspiracy' he changed his name to Vijay Singh Pathik, and then he was known by this name till the end of his life. Due to love and respect, he is also known as 'Rajasthan Kesari' and 'Rashtriya Pathik' among the people.

Vijay Singh Pathik was one of the brave revolutionaries who fought for India's independence. He came in contact with revolutionaries like Rash Behari Bose and Sachindra Nath Sanyal in his youth. Long before Mahatma Gandhi's 'Satyagraha Movement', Vijay Singh Pathik had started the task of awakening the farmers for freedom through a movement known as 'Bijolia Kisan Andolan'. He played a key role in taking the freedom struggle to the villages and towns. He went from village to village and organized people and motivated them to join the peasant movement. It is believed that in this movement the British had to bow down and accept the demands of the farmers.

Vijay Singh Pathik was also a good poet, writer, and journalist who used his writing to spread the message of freedom to the common people. He started his journalism during the freedom movement and brought out a weekly paper named 'Rajasthan Kesari'. Afraid of his popularity in Rajasthan and Madhya Pradesh, the government banned it. Pathik also made his mark as an author by writing several books. Due to his efforts 'Rajasthan Seva Sangh' was established in Ajmer in 1920. This organization raised its voice against the evil practices spread in society. Vijay Singh Pathik died on 28 May 1954. In 1992, the Government of India issued a postage stamp in memory of the revolutionary poet Vijay Singh Pathik.

RAFI AHMED KIDWAI: RAISED HIS VOICE FOR THE WELFARE OF FARMERS



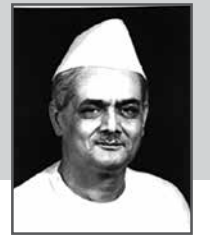
BORN: 18 FEBRUARY 1894, DIED: 24 OCTOBER 1954

Rafi Ahmed Kidwai, who played an active role in India's freedom movement, was born in a landlord family on 18 February 1894 in the Barabanki district of Uttar Pradesh. Despite this, he raised his voice for the welfare of the poor and farmers. He worked to free the farmers from the zamindari system. He was constantly striving to end the exploitation of the farmers by the landlords. He is also remembered for taking tough decisions without wavering in the midst of challenges. He became active in the freedom movement while studying law and became popular due to his extraordinary organizational skills. He was especially active in the Khilafat Movement in the 1920s and also joined the Non-Cooperation Movement at the call of Mahatma Gandhi. Rafi Kidwai was arrested many times and remained in jail for a long time in many movements including the non-cooperation movement.

After his every release from jail, he would come out with new enthusiasm and inspire people more fervently by holding public meetings against British rule. His biggest strength was that he went beyond all limits to help people. Rafi Ahmed Kidwai was also elected to the Constituent Assembly from the United Provinces. After the country got independence, he was appointed as the Minister of Communications. He inaugurated the first-night air mail service. The first Van Mahotsav was celebrated in the country in 1950 by the then Environment Minister Rafi Ahmed Kidwai. Its purpose was to create awareness about the impact of deforestation on wildlife and forest dwellers. Since 1950, Van Mahotsav is celebrated annually during the first week of July from 1st July to 7th July. Rafi Ahmed Kidwai died on 24 October 1954.

GANESH VASUDEV MAVALANKAR

LEFT LAW PRACTICE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE FREEDOM MOVEMENT



BORN: 27 NOVEMBER 1888, DIED: 27 FEBRUARY 1956

Ganesh Vasudev Mavalankar, India's renowned freedom fighter and the first speaker of the Lok Sabha, was born on 27 November 1888 in Baroda, Gujarat. He is also fondly known as 'Dadasaheb' and GV Mavalankar. Mavalankar came to Ahmedabad in the year 1902 for higher education and did his B.A from 'Gujarat College'. After obtaining a law degree from 'Mumbai University', he started a law practice in Ahmedabad and within a short span of time carved a niche for himself.

However, having a keen interest in social work as well, he came in contact with eminent leaders like Mahatma Gandhi and Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, and within a short span of time he joined many prominent social organizations in Gujarat. He played an active role in the independence movement from Gujarat in the 1930s-1940s and went to jail several times. He spent about six years in jail and undertook reform work for the welfare of inmates. He was a learned man with knowledge of several languages. He also actively participated in the Non-Cooperation Movement and Salt Satyagraha. Mavalankar always played a pivotal role in rescue work during times of natural calamity, famine, social crisis, or any kind of political crisis. He exhibited a special interest in writing and has many literary achievements.

His book 'Manavtana Jharna' written in the Gujarati language consists of true stories of the prisoners whom he met and guided during their prison term from the period of 1942 to 1944 during the freedom struggle. GV Mavalankar was elected to the Bombay Legislative Assembly in 1937 representing Ahmedabad city. He was the Speaker of the Bombay Legislative Assembly from 1937 to 1946. He was elected the first Speaker of the Lok Sabha in May 1952 after the first general elections of independent India and was elected unopposed. As Speaker of the first Lok Sabha, Mavalankar set procedures and conventions in line with the ethos of the country. ■

NEW DELHI: The first Union Budget of Amrit Kaal, or the 25 years in the run-up to 2047 when Independent India turns 100, will build a strong foundation for a developed India and fulfil the dreams of an aspirational society including the poor, the middle-class, and farmers, Prime Minister Narendra Modi said on Wednesday.
In a televised speech soon after Union finance minister Nirmala Sitharaman presented the Budget in Parliament, Modi said the provisions prioritise the deprived sections, including craftspeople, who he



dubbed as the creators of the nation.
The Budget announced assistance for craftsmen that will enable them to improve the quality, scale and reach of their products, while integrating them with the MSME value chain, he said. The scheme will also afford access to advanced skill training, knowledge of modern digital techniques, and efficient green technologies and social security, he added.
"For the first time, the country has come up with many schemes as a tribute to the hard work and creation of these people. Arrangements have been made for training, credit and market support," he said.

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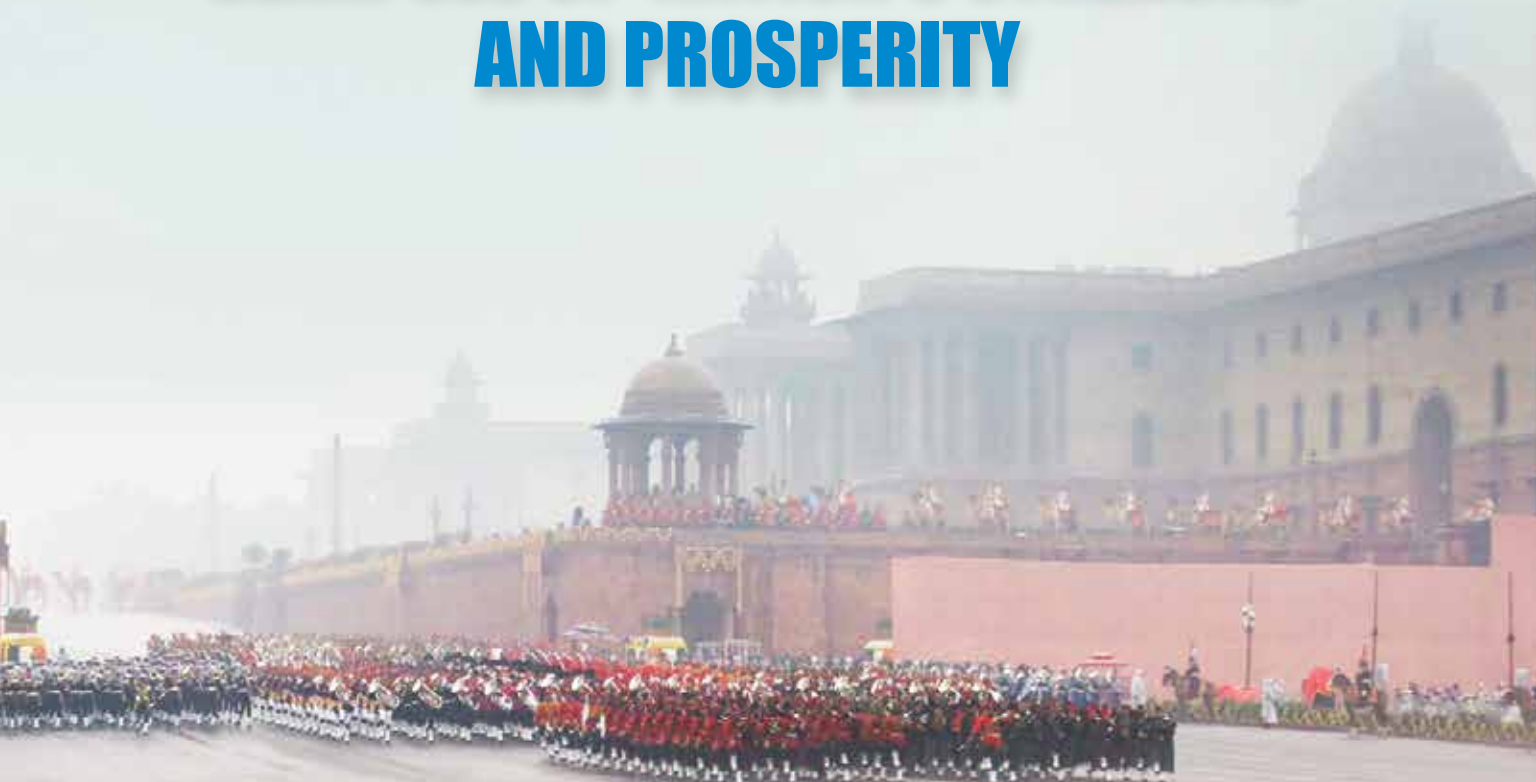
