Celebration of Constitution Day 2021

The Constitution Day was celebrated under the aegis of 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsav' at the Event Hall of the Embassy. Ambassador H.E. Shri R. Chandramouli read the Preamble of the Constitution with all the India-based Mission Officials in the morning.

In the evening the Mission organized an event in the Embassy Event Hall. Ambassador H.E. Shri R. Chandramouli in his address recalled the socio-economic and political contexts, under which the Constituent Assembly drafted the constitution. Ambassador also mentioned some of the salient features of Indian Constitution, including Fundamental Rights and duties and the Directive Principles of State Policy etc.

The Mission had invited two Speakers for the Event. The first Guest speaker Mr. Youssouf Ali Robleh, a Law professor from the University of Djibouti, brought out the salient aspects of constitution of Djibouti. He also drew parallels between Indian

and Djiboutian Constitution. The second speaker Mr. Nasser Mohamed Isse, an eminent lawyer, highlighted the provisions in the Djiboutian constitution to safeguard the rights of the people. He also described the commonality between the constitutional provisions of both the countries.

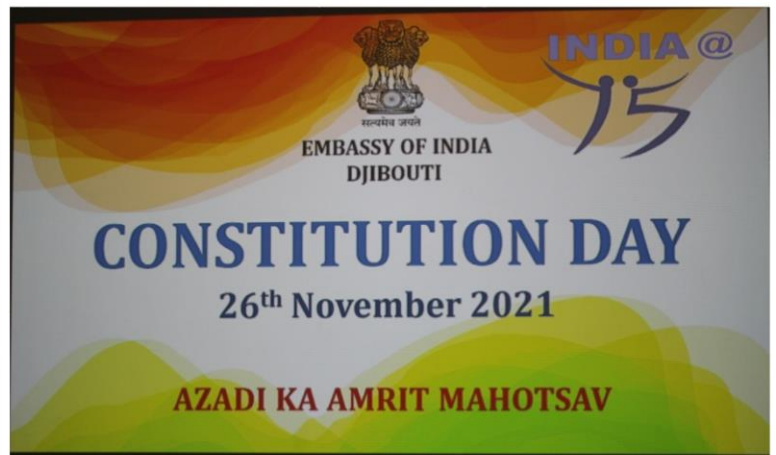
